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# Funding successes

Congratulations to recent successful applicants to

#### **Arts Victoria's Arts Development For Communities Grants**

#### Ausdance Victoria

\$17,000 for Communities of the Prom Coast (Foster, Toora, Welshpool and Fish Creek) who will collaborate with artists, Anna Smith (choreographer) and Alison Lester (writer) on Fire Up - a new dance work. The work will be presented as part of the Prom Coast Seachange Festival in April, 2007.

## **Auspicious Arts Projects**

\$10, 000 for The Book of Temperament project to bring together professional artists, community groups and individuals in the creation and presentation of performances and an interactive installation work. The Great Wall of Books, a public space installation, will be situated in Federation Square and provide the infrastructure for the work.

#### **CERES, East Brunswick**

\$10,00 for Grapevine, a community storytelling project at CERES to be presented as part of the Autumn Harvest Festival in March, 2007. The project will explore Victoria's multicultural heritage, sharing cultural traditions and rituals and stories of food and migration.

## **Footscray Community Arts Centre**

\$30,000 for a residency at Footscray Community Arts Centre, Ben Cobham and Andrew Livingston of Bluebottle 3 will design and develop a pod (a portable structure made from recyclable material) in collaboration with communities from the City of Maribyrnong. The project will explore how communities can create, inhabit and share spaces.

# Maribyrnong Festival Ltd

\$20,000 Bus is a performance event that will take busloads of audience members on different journeys in Melbourne's western suburbs. Directors, Jessica Wilson, Ian Pidd and Bec Reid will collaborate with community groups to create the performances for the 2007 Big West Festival.

# **Marngoneet Correctional Centre**

\$9810 for Zoe Snyder to work with prisoners at Marngoneet Correctional Centre to create four ceramic sculptures for the visitors' section of the prison facility.

## Mildura Rural City Council

\$30,000 for 'The Crossing' is a performance event on Lock Island, Mildura. Artist, Jill Orr will work with local Koories and invited Victorian Butoh dancers to develop a contemporary work using dance and music from both the Aboriginal and Butoh forms.

#### **Moreland City Council**

\$10,00 for Tactile Impressions, a collaboration between artist Forest Keegel, students from the Coburg Special Developmental and Coburg North Primary Schools, and local community group, Friends of Harmony Park. The project will create sculptural works for a local park in a mixed ability playground.

## **Multicultural Arts Victoria**

\$20,310 for Vaudeville Voodoo, part of MAV's Emerge program working with refugee artists. The project will develop a series of acts for presentation in a vaudevillian style concert. Presentations will include hip hop, theatre and circus.

#### **SPAN Co-operative Ltd**

\$10,00 for Costas Athanassiou (photographer) and Carmelina Di Guglielmo (theatre) to collaborate with the tenants at the Holmes St high rise estate in Northcote. The 140 tenants come from diverse cultural backgrounds and all are over 55. The storytelling project will culminate in a DVD and theatrical performances of some of the stories.

## Victoria University of Technology

\$20,000 for 'Shopping: More than Retail Therapy', a collaborative arts project involving performance artist, Sue Dodd and writer, Enza Gandolfo which will explore the role of op shops in the community. The project will produce an exhibition of new work as a result of interviews and workshops with people from the western suburbs of Melbourne.

## Western Edge Youth Arts

\$15,00 for Excavations, a collaboration between artists and young women which will uncover female characters real life, popular culture and literature with a view to creating a new work of documentary theatre, interwoven with movement, sound and projection.

#### Yooralla

\$10,640 for The Independent Living Art Centre Project, a collaboration between contemporary artists, Geoff Robinson, Tim Burke, Laresa Kosloff and Helen Johnson and children from Yooralla's two special education schools at Glenroy and Belmore. The project is supported by ArtPlay, with the work to be installed at Yooralla's Independent Living Centre in Brooklyn.

# Youth Substance Abuse Service Day Program

\$10,00 for Youth Substance Abuse Service (YSAS) to develop a website that will be a home for ideas, art and information. Young people aged 12-21 will collaborate with digital artists and IT workers

#### **Arts Residencies Grants**

## **Bendigo Chinese Association Museum Inc**

\$14,000 for Bendigo's Golden Dragon Museum will host Kita Performing Arts Company to undertake a series of workshops culminating in a public performance in September 2007 as part of the inaugural Autumn Harvest Moon Festival. Workshops, including dance, music and martial arts, will engage local schools and cultural groups.

#### **Brunswick Women's Theatre**

\$22,500 for Brunswick Women's Theatre to continue their work in the City of Hume with the creation of a new performance work, Invisibility. The project will build on the networks and skills developed during their 2006 residency also supported through the Arts Residencies program.

## City of Whittlesea

\$38,864 for Snuff Puppets to undertake a residency in the City of Whittlesea working with First Impressions Youth Theatre and the local FReeZA group to create a performance for the annual Whittlesea Community Festival.

# Frankston City Council

\$47,000 for a partnership between Frankston Arts Centre and Westside Circus to provide workshops for young participants in circus training, music and new media. It will also provide opportunities for young people to acquire skills in event management and leadership. The workshops will culminate in a public performance.

## More Than Opera Ltd

\$42, 230 for More Than Opera to undertake a residency at Malmsbury Juvenile Justice Centre for young men aged 18-21. A series of music, movement, text and design workshops will lead to the presentation of a piece of new work in the Christmas concert. A second stage will see a more substantial work created.

# **The Torch Project**

\$37,290 for The Torch project to undertake workshops in the thirteen geographical regions, including Shepparton, Mildura, Warrnambool, Swan Hill, Kerang, Robinvale, Bendigo, East Gippsland and the Mornington Peninsula. The performance works developed will be presented locally and at a statewide gathering
