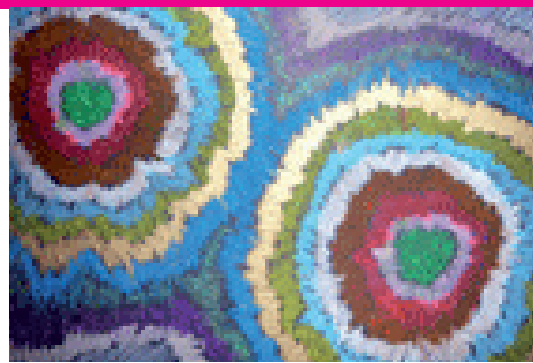


You will benefit from this conference if you are:

Lisa Fitzhugh is the founder and Executive Director of Artscorps, a non-profit youth development program that partners with schools and community organisations to bring free after-school arts classes to low-income young people in Seattle USA. Since its inception in 2000, Arts Corps has grown from an enrolment of 400 students at 10 partner sites in 2000 to

2,700 students in 139 quarterly classes at 31 partner facilities in 2008. Artscorps has been deemed a US national leader in excellent arts programming by Harvard University's Project Zero, a graduate research program on arts education and creativity and the National Partnership for Quality After-school Learning.

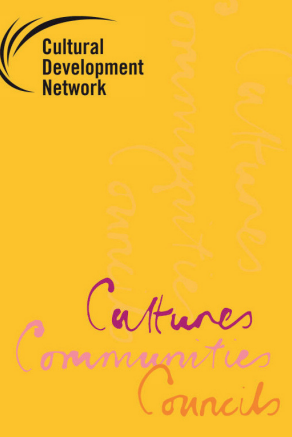
