

June was a very busy month for the Cultural Development Network with three conferences exploring creative schools and community partnerships held across Victoria.

'Connecting Schools and Communities' conferences, 20-23 June

At these recent series of one day conferences, keynote speaker Lisa Fitzhugh, Founder and Executive Director of Artscorps, Seattle, USA inspired audiences with stories about the establishment of the organisation she founded. Artscorps, after eight years of operation, now provides after school classes for 2400 disadvantaged young people in 139 quarterly classes at 31 partner facilities across Seattle. Feedback from participants about Lisa's contribution was very positive: Lisa was fantastic; so inspiring; outstanding; great to have Lisa speak about spirit and humanity in arts- very warm and inspiring.

In Colac, Williamstown and Wodonga, Lisa's presentation was complemented by talks from local and visiting presenters; artists, education professionals, teachers, community workers and academics, as well plenty of discussion and networking and some performances. And from one delegate, the kind of feedback we love to receive: Every single speaker was fantastic!

The turnout at all three events was excellent. More than 300 people altogether enjoyed time meeting and talking, and hopefully will be more inspired to develop their own creative partnerships in their local communities. Papers from the conference will gradually be loaded up onto our website, so even if you missed the opportunity, you will be able to read about some of the presentations.

Arts and Disability Research project: how can participation in the arts be increased for people with disabilities?

We are working on to finish off Stage 1, the literature review and Discussion Paper for this project. These lead into Stage 2, the consultation phase, to help us establish how participation in the arts for people with disabilities can be increased. Over the next few months, we will begin developing a series of forums and focus aroups, through which people from all over Victoria, from a range of arts and other organisations, as well as individual artists and audience members, can discuss their experiences and concerns. Later in the year, international disability advocate, dance artist and academic Petra Kuppers, from Michigan USA, will spend an extended period here in Victoria leading some of these events.
