**UPDATE **Exploring the Role of Culture and the Arts: An Executive Education Initiative

Since announcing this initiative in the last E-Bulletin, Cultural Development Network and the Centre for Cultural Partnerships at University of Melbourne has received positive feedback about the inaugural Local Government Executive Education initiative for senior managers and key officers in arts and community development.

In view of feedback regarding time constraints, the program has been revised to be a tightly focussed one day forum instead of the previously proposed three days designed to support senior managers and key officers (in areas such as community services, community development and arts and culture) to build the case for culture and the arts initiatives in local government policy settings.

Advocating for the role of cultural development and local government in progress towards the Millennium Development Goals

Our colleagues at the Committee on Culture, United Cities and Local Government, (the peak international body for local government) are campaigning for the cultural dimension and the role of local government to be considered in international strategies to progress the Millennium Development Goals. UCLG's research indicates that there is a strong correlation between successful national and local strategies to achieve the MDGs, and explicit consideration of culture as a dimension in development.

This month the General Assembly of United Nations meet in New York to review the progress towards the MDGs. UCLG encourages us to add our voices to their advocacy campaign for this important initiative. Find out more about UCLG's work and the advocacy strategies they suggest.
